# TALL-SHIP SAILING

Set sail in the Mediterranean

**BEST BET:** Star Clippers (from about 170 to 225 guests)

**AGENDA:** Three of the world's largest and tallest traditional clipper ships are modern and comfortable, ferrying spirited passengers to the glamorous coastal cities and exotic islands of Spain, France, Italy, Croatia, Slovenia and Greece via dozens of itineraries.


**HIGHLIGHTS:** Explore hilltop fortresses, wander through quaint villages, ogle yacht-filled marinas, climb to the top of the crow's nest and canoodle in the bowsprit netting.

**CROWD:** This is an old-school, international crowd of people who love sailing and feel at home around the traditional trappings of teak, brass and blue velvet.

**TIMING:** Five- to 11-night sailings from April to November

© BONUS: These ships are small enough to dock at ports the larger ones can't access. This translates to smaller crowds, varied itineraries nd a more local experience. The new Flying Clipper launches this year.

### **CLASSIC VOYAGE**

Cruise the Caribbean on a luxury liner

**BEST BET:** Celebrity Edge from Celebrity Cruises (just over 3,000 guests)

AGENDA: Embark on an eastern or western Caribbean cruise from Fort Lauderdale, Florida, to exotic locales such as St. Maarten, British Virgin Islands, Puerto Rico, Grand Cayman, Mexico and more.

**HIGHLIGHTS:** Fascinating ports aside, the high-style luxury and elegant design of this new \$1 billion ship steals the show. Out-there features include a living wall, a top-deck park and a cantilevered platform lounge that can move from sea level to the top of the ship.

**CROWD:** Special-occasion celebrants and families who don't mind sharing their holiday with 3,000 people

**TIMING:** Seven-night adventures in paradise from December to April

**☼** BONUS: Unlike many large-scale ocean liners, the Edge boasts global cuisine from 29 eateries and bars – and one of the largest wine cellars at sea.

### ARCTIC EXPEDITION

Sweep through the fjords of Greenland

**BEST BET:** Quark Expeditions (from about 80 to 175 guests)

**AGENDA:** Fly or sail from Iceland to Greenland to experience the rugged beauty of the world's largest island along its east, south or southwest coasts.


**HIGHLIGHTS:** Zip through ice-filled bays and fjords in a Zodiac boat, hike the Arctic tundra on the lookout for elusive wildlife and witness the Northern Lights. Plus, you really can't take a bad picture of the sculpture-like icebergs.

**CROWD:** Well-travelled, well-heeled and intrepid adventurers who easily connect with nature

**TIMING:** Ten- and 15-day expeditions in August and September

**☼ BONUS:** Visits to isolated, modern communities to witness their way of life are extraordinary, as are treks through ancient Indigenous encampments.

## RIVERBOAT LUXURY

Drift down the Danube River

**BEST BET:** One of the "Spaceships" from Scenic Luxury Cruises & Tours (about 170 guests)

AGENDA: Settle into sumptuous digs and float away for a week – or a month. Budapest is a hub for trips west to Nuremberg (and even Amsterdam) and east all the way to the Black Sea.

### **SMALL-SHIP ADVENTURE**

Explore the Pacific coast of Panama and Costa Rica

**BEST BET:** UnCruise Adventures (about 60 guests)

**AGENDA:** Swing through the Panama Canal before heading north up the Pacific coastline, hitting tropical islands and inlets, into the Gulf of Nicoya and inland to San José – or the reverse.

**HIGHLIGHTS:** Experience national conservation areas, untamed wildlife – monkeys, hummingbirds, toucans, whales! – gorgeous coastline, rainforest and mangroves, while exploring, hiking, paddling and soaking up Indigenous cultures.

**CROWD:** Primarily a fleece-forward group of couples, siblings, families and young-athearts (i.e. everyone likely owns hiking boots)

**TIMING:** Eight-, 10- and 12-night cruises year-round, with the exception of May and October.

BONUS: Some itineraries have a fitness and yoga focus that promote whole-body health, making the adventure even more active.
